Content

Case/law/policy development: Five manuals intended for designated stakeholders (politicians, judges and legal practitioners, local and regional gender equality commissions, gender equality coordinators in state administrative bodies, and for employees of the Office for Gender Equality) were published as a result of the Twinning project "Support for Gender Equality".¹ Manuals were published in print, but they are also easily accessible online on the website of the Office for Gender Equality (in Croatian and English).

Key points of analysis: The Twinning project "Support for Gender Equality" was implemented by the Government's Office for Gender Equality in cooperation with twinning partner, the National Institute for Health and Welfare of the Republic of Finland. The project was financed through the Transition Facility Instrument for Croatia. The total project budget was EUR 600 000, with EUR 570 000 financed by the EU and the rest by Croatia. The total duration of the project was 18 months, and the period of its implementation in Croatia was from May 2016 to August 2017. The deliverables of the project include five manuals intended to enhance the application of gender equality principles and legislation in practice. Since 2018, the manuals are accessible online on the website of the Office for Gender Equality.
